Skaha Estates Improvement District Update March 2024

The Trustees were finally able to get a meeting with our Drinking Water Officer from Interior Health Authority and want to share the following information:

- we now have a clear understanding of what information they want and are working towards providing it.
- it includes daily minimum, maximum and average chlorine and turbidity readings as well as temperature, chlorine contact time and PH readings from our system.
- we will now be sampling water from five different field locations three times per week, which is much more comprehensive than we have done in the past.
- after seeing a consistent pattern as well as no failed water samples, the Boil Water Notice will be replaced with a Water Quality Advisory until such time as we have achieved secondary disinfection, which will be a number of years. (See attachments below for more information on these advisories.)

In consultation with the Interior Health Authority, it is being advised to all residents of the Skaha Estates Improvement District that:

"The SEID Water System uses a surface water source that can contain protozoa such as Cryptosporidium and Giardia."

The SEID Water System does not provide treatment to inactivate or remove protozoa. (Secondary disinfection is required for this.)

Protozoa like *Cryptosporidium* and *Giardia* in drinking water can cause gastrointestinal illness.

People who have a greater chance of getting sick include:

- People with weakened immune systems, such as those who have HIV/AIDS, an organ or bone marrow transplant, or who have had cancer treatment
- Infants and young children
- · Pregnant women
- · Older adults
- · People with a chronic disease

People more sensitive to waterborne illnesses can have severe reactions and serious complications, including death. For more information, see HealthLinkBC File #56Preventing water-borne infections for people with weakened immune systems."

- the Okanagan watershed is impacted by treated sewage water from many communities as well as other agricultural, industrial, automotive, residential and natural contamination. As the population grows, the water quality will only decline.
- the RDOS continues to do their due diligence on acquiring our water system and expects to hold a community referendum later this year. More information about this will be forthcoming when we receive it.

The SEID board reminds residents that an in-house ultra-violet ray or reverse osmosis filtration system will free you from having to boil water.

- Please be advised that the 2024 Water Tax and Toll Invoice is due by March 31, 2024, payment can be made by e-Transfer to: skahaestateswater@gmail.com or by mailing a cheque payable to: Skaha Estates Improvement District, PO Box 455, Okanagan Falls, BC VOH 1R0, please note there is a 12% penalty on unpaid accounts at March 31st.
